The topic was 'Sports people that use performance enhancing drugs should receive a life ban' and our team was the negative. In the rules of the competition only one hour is given to prepare the topic.

The team made an excellent effort and although they weren't the final winners they are to be commended for their well-developed arguments and analytical thinking. Well done to the team on this outstanding achievement.

#### Courage to Care Exhibition

On Thursday November 21 Year 12 Advanced English and Years 9 and 10 Elective History travelled to the Wagga Wagga Museum of the Riverina to attend a Courage to Care Program. The program

explored issues of discrimination, prejudice, bullying and tolerance through Holocaust stories from World War II. Students participated in three sessions including an exhibition, an encounter with a Holocaust survivor and a discussion group forum.

The encounter with a survivor enabled students to learn about personal accounts of survival and the strength and courage that was needed during this time period. The survival story also shed significant light on how rescuers had the courage to care for these individuals and for others in need.

As the key presenter highlighted our students will be the last generation to hear these personal accounts from actual survivors.

The exhibition section included eyewitness recorded stories and artefacts to provide students with a deeper insight into events that occurred during the Holocaust.

This was an excellent opportunity for students to gain an enriched perspective and to make connections to contemporary society.

Dear Parent/Guardian

I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with some information about the public dental services available for children in the Albury area.

Murrumbidgee Local Health District employs dental therapists at the Albury Community Health Centre dental clinic which is located at 596 Smollett Street, Albury. Dental therapists are registered clinicians who provide general dental treatment for children and adolescents up to the age of 18 years.

The treatment is free. Please ring 1800 450 046 to register your child.

In addition, I would like to provide you with some information about the dental program that has been established between NSW Health, the Murrumbidgee Local Health District and Charles Sturt University (CSU) to provide free dental treatment for children who have been registered with the public dental service but have not yet received an appointment at the Albury dental clinic.

The children will be treated by  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  year Bachelor of Oral Health students at the CSU dental clinic in Thurgoona under strict supervision.

If your child/ren are not already registered with the public dental service, please phone the intake centre on 1800 450 046 to register. Please indicate to the intake staff if you would be happy for your child/ren to be treated at either clinic, that is either Albury dental clinic or CSU, depending upon which clinic has the first available appointment.
