

Next week will be the final P&C Meeting for the year, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all P&C members for their commitment and participation in 2017 - particularly Mark Leov for filling the role of president. The P&C meets eight times a year and meetings are open to all parents and citizens of our school community. Each meeting is a completely open forum where any issues can be raised and the Principal or Deputy Principal are always in attendance to help answer or clarify anything. The P&C does not make school decisions, but it is a very valuable forum in which to get an indication parent and community feedback. Alternatively, parents can always contact the school directly, and have queries answered by school staff, including the Deputy Principal and Principal.

A recent question has been raised about school sport, and there has been a good deal of misinformation in some public forums within our community. I would like to reinforce that school sport has not been banned, nor has inter-school sport or sport for senior students been banned. The very idea of

these things being 'banned' is outrageous, and categorically incorrect. NSW Public Schools, including Billabong High School, actively promote participation in a range of sports, and the pursuit of a healthy lifestyle. As well as compulsory Wednesday afternoon sport; compulsory PDHPE; school cross country, athletics and swimming carnivals; each year the school decides which inter-school sports competitions to enter. In deciding this, the overall curriculum and school resources need to be considered, particularly the time and staff needed to support sports competitions, and all other initiatives.

For 2018 the BHS executive team decided that an appropriate balance of sport was to have a senior/opens team and a junior/U15s team in a knockout competition for each sport that had enough student and staff interest. We agreed to support all CHSSA (Combined High Schools Sporting Association) sports as a priority over locally run competitions, meaning that our teams have the chance to win a state championship if they are good enough. As there is only one CHS competition offered for Boys Australian Rules Football, we

have supplemented this in 2018 by entering a second boys team in a non-CHS competition, and entering junior and senior girls teams in non-CHS competitions. This means a total of two boys and two girls teams will be entered, rather than having four boys teams entered, as was done in the past. For boys cricket, CHS offers the Davidson Shield for seniors, so there was no reason to double-up and enter the locally run Rixon Cup for seniors. So for 2018 the options are Davidson Shield for senior boys and Milliken Cup for juniors.

For 2018 we are also structuring Wednesday afternoon sport so that representative teams can train during that time, allowing our teams to improve their skills and to participate more genuinely in inter-school sport competitions. Clearly, sport has not been 'banned' at Billabong High School – in fact, by increasing training we will have higher quality, safer sport, and could expect even better performance than in the past. If students, parents or community members would like further clarification, they are asked to please contact the school directly.

I will be on long service leave for the rest of the year and Ms Julie Bowen will be relieving as Principal. Ms Jobe will be Deputy Principal and Mrs Fenwick will relieve as Head Teacher English. I look forward to returning in 2018 and continuing our journey towards improved student learning outcomes at Billabong High School.
