

I would like to take a moment to acknowledge the extreme challenges faced by so many New South Wales residents, schools and students over the past week as they face emergency and catastrophic fire conditions. Statewide, the burnt area covers 1,650,000 hectares - more than during the past three bushfire seasons combined - and we are only in November. 476 homes have been lost so far (compared to 37 in last year's season). 600 NSW schools were closed and some are still affected by fire danger this week. As a school community, I know our thoughts have been with those suffering. We appreciate that, on this occasion our community is not directly involved, and that our students have been able to continue enjoying their school activities.

Last week, Year 12 enjoyed an excellent formal event with family, friends and school staff. A special thanks to our parent speakers, Mr Lionel Plunkett and Mr George Mackinlay. Also, an enormous 'thank you' to the organisers, Mrs Morgan and Mrs Mackinlay. It was a proud occasion for students and parents. Congratulations and best wishes to Year 12.

This week, Tine, Bianca and Kendra will travel to Sydney to perform in the Schools Spectacular. They have been practising for the event and are no doubt excited by what promises to be a very significant and valuable experience for them. Thanks to the staff, students and community members who have supported this opportunity. We will be watching for you on the television broadcast!

This week, staff and students will be focusing on ensuring that we are all able to get on with our day free from verbal harassment. Students and staff have been asked to think about the conversations that are occurring in the classroom and playground,

Let's work together to ensure our school is the respectful, safe, positive space that we all expect it to be for our students and staff.
