Fun Facts from HSIE Faculty

2. The Jim Crow Laws legalised racial segregation in the USA for about 100 years. AskaYear9studenttotellyouhowtherecent Black Lives Matter protests relate to past civil rights protests in the USA and the world.

3. The Human Development Index (HDI) is used to measure the wellbeing of people living in certain countries. Norway is ranked number one and Niger is ranked last. Ask a Year 10 student about how the HDI is measured and where Australia is ranked compared to other countries in the world.

4. The three elements of crime are mens rea (guilty mind), actus reus (guilty act) and causation. Ask a Year 12 Legal Studies student about how the elements of crime were demonstrated in the case of R V Dean (2013) NSWSC where Roger Dean was found guilty of eleven counts of murder after setting fire to a wing of the Quakers Hill Nursing Home.
