In addition to this news, on Friday I was unexpectedly contacted by an Executive Director from Sydney, and I have been asked to relieve as Director, Educational Leadership for a network in the Metropolitan South of Sydney. I will begin in that role as of Monday next week, meaning that this week will be my last for now at Billabong High School. Although this was unexpected, we have already conducted significant planning for next year's restructure, so we are in a very good place to simply bring our plans forward to next week. Several staff members have already filled higher roles when I was recently in the Hume Director role, so we certainly have the staff capacity to achieve this successfully now and into the future.

For now I would like to thank staff, students and community members who have supported improved learning outcomes for students at Billabong High School over the five years that I have been principal. When I came to Billabong High School I was struck

We're not looking for "comfortable", "close enough" or "what we've always done." We are pursuing excellence, as defined by the School Excellence Framework. This active pursuit requires commitment, expertise, professionalism and disciplined execution over time. It means putting student outcomes at the centre of all decisionmaking, and often involves (all of us) making difficult or challenging decisions in order to achieve outcomes for students.

Our success at achieving this is reflected in our clear ongoing commitment to instructional leadership and high quality professional learning for staff, an increase in the number of staff seeking accreditation hiaher and leadership development opportunities, and of course our significant improvement in student growth, including Billabong High School achieving the highest NAPLAN scores in the Riverina. Our success is exemplified by initiatives such as the establishment of Aurora College, the Thrive program, our growing Special Education and Learning Support capabilities, and in our exemplary management of continuity of learning during COVID-19. I am confident that this year's HSC marks will indicate an upward trend, and that next year's HSC marks will confirm that trend - especially with Julie Bowen leading the team with clear commitment, direction and purpose.

As a proud employee of the NSW Department of Education, my commitment has been, and will always be, to improve
