# Mathematics/Art Faculty Report - Mr Justin Lawson

Students in Mathematics have been actively engaged in their learning this semester. Students have been excited to work on our brand-new digital platform, Education Perfect. Education Perfect has provided students with the opportunities for deep critical thinking through lessons that contain engaging images and videos. EP for Mathematics covers key concepts aimed at Years 7-10. These lessons cover core skills in Mathematics to ensure students have a sound understanding of the topic before they begin their senior high school years. It is also important to note that students can access this platform at any time they desire.

In Art, students have been busy looking at artist Wassily Kandinsky and abstract expressionism. This has involved students closing their eyes and listening to excerpts of music. While listening, each individual works on a physical interpretation of the sounds in which they hear, and they create an image onto a page.





### Captains visit to Sydney - Robert and Madison

On Tuesday 8 June, we gladly took the opportunity to travel to Sydney for the opportunity to meet members of NSW Parliament and the Governor of NSW, Her Excellency The Honourable Margaret Beazley AO QC.

Tuesday night began with some exploration of the Sydney CBD, with some unintentional orienteering in the rain after our navigational skills failed us. We felt like we'd settled into Sydney well, after returning to our hotel soaked.



Wednesday's weather was much more welcoming, as we again explored Sydney's landscape in our spare time. We visited the Opera House, Hyde Park and the busy area of George Street's shopping district. We fit in well with Sydney fashion, travelling around in our school blazers.



Once we arrived at parliament, we had the opportunity to meet multiple members of NSW Parliament, including the member for Albury, Justin Clancy MP. They explained to us their pathways into government, and what their purpose is within our community. We also got to meet the school leaders from James Fallon High, Albury High and Murray High. Justin gave us the opportunity to watch the Legislative Assembly first hand before he presented a new bill.

After our experience at Parliament House, we travelled down to Government House to meet the Governor of NSW. She was surprisingly down to earth, and was happy to answer any of our questions. She gave insight into her pathway to being Governor, rising through the ranks of the legal system before being endorsed by the Queen herself. She told us about her everyday duties, and some of her more interesting opportunities. She described her role as encompassing the 3 Cs: constitutional, ceremonial and community.

The trip was an amazing opportunity to experience and understand what the actual role of members of parliament is, alongside the varying pathways into government. We're very thankful to Mr Eccleston and Ms Bowen for allowing us the opportunity.



### Covid Catch-Up Program in the Learning Hub - Ms Elizabeth Murdoch

Our students involved in the Covid Catch-Up Program have been working brilliantly over the past term. We are very pleased with their progress. Our Learning Hub tutors have now worked with 53 students across Years 7-9 during Terms 1 and 2, with another 43 students from Years 7-10 joining the program in Term 3.

Students have improved their skills in spelling, reading comprehension, grammar, punctuation, writing and fluency. Every student who participates in the program will be plotted on the Literacy Progressions using the PLAN2 recording tool. This assists our tutors in identifying areas of strength and areas for improvement and allows classroom teachers to work with students in developing specific aspects of their literacy.





#### HSC Minimum Standards - Ms Elizabeth Murdoch

Students need reading, writing and numeracy for everyday life after school. This is why students in NSW are being supported to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the HSC. To show they meet the HSC minimum standard, students need to achieve Level 3 or 4 in short online reading, writing and numeracy tests of skills for everyday life.

Students can take the tests from Year 10 until up to five years after starting their first HSC course. We will begin our minimum standards testing with Year 10 early next term. Students who do not achieve minimum standards in their first attempt have the opportunity to sit each test up to four times per year. Our Learning Hub tutors will work with students in Years 11 and 12 who require extra support to achieve their minimum standards.

We will talk to our Year 10 students about HSC Minimum Standards over the coming weeks. 
